DECLINE IN BULL MOOSE AND DEMOCRATIC VOTE

Edward B. Wilcox of New York Sees Gain in Republican Strength.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 21.—Edward B. Wilcox, of New York, a merchant and manufacturer for over thirty years and a voter for fifty years, sees in the large falling off of the democratic and bull moose, and an increase in the republican vote in the Second district of Iowa, a desire of the people to return to republican rule. The democratic vote in the district fell off 30 per cent and the progressive vote over 60 per cent. The republican alone showed a gain over the presidential figures of 1912. "Two years hence," Mr. Wilcox said, "the long suffering public, including democrats and progressives, will call upon the republicans of the true brand to nominate a leader who will conduct them to the land of prosperity again. I know what the poverty makers during the last democratic administration cost me and my 250 employes and their families."

Some of the Big Sums to be Paid for Income Tax by the Millionaires.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.] NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—Having left Cleveland because of the tax assessment endavors to show that city to be his legal residence, John D. Rockefeller will declare Tarrytown his home and file his income tax here. His income tax will be \$6,000,000. This will probably be the largest individual tax the government will collect. Andrew Carnegie is expected to pay the second largest tax here. Returns on incomes must be filed by next Monday. Estimates on some of the taxes to be paid are: Carnegie, \$900,000; Wm. Rockefeller, \$600,000; Geo. F. Baker, \$300,000; J. P. Morgan, estate, \$450,000; Mrs. E. H. Harriman, \$210,000; Mrs. Russell Sage, \$200,000; W. K. Vanderbilt, \$150,000; Vincent Astor, \$225,000; Jay Gould estate, \$225,000; Mrs. Hetty Green, \$180,000; Robert Goeliet estate, \$180,000; Thomas F. Ryan, \$150,000.
