### GOOD FRIDAY IS OBSERVED LOCALLY

Services in Catholic and Episcopal Churches Mark Day in This City.

Good Friday or the anniversary of the crucifixion of Christ was observed today all over the world. In Keokuk the event was observed with the usual services. There were services in the Catholic churches of the city and also at the Episcopal church.

At noon today the bells in the tower of St. John's church tolled for five minutes. It was at noon tide that the crucifixion of the Lord was said to have occurred centuries ago. Following the tolling of the bells, a three hours devotional service was held at St. John's this afternoon.

The forty days of lent will end on Sunday which will be Easter day and the commemoration of the resurrection of the saviour.
