Filled With Big United Press Report, It Gave First News to People.

It was made possible through the magnificent report served by the United Press which kept its wires working all during the day.

### BEFORE MEETING OF CABINET

President Urged to Hand Passports to Huerta's Representative in Washington.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.]  
WASHINGTON, April 20.—When the cabinet went into session at 10:30 o'clock it was understood that the president planned to take up the entire Mexican situation including the position of the constitutionalists. It was reported that the president had been urged to hand Senor Alzara, the Mexican charge d'affaires his passports with the explanation that he could no longer be considered a part of diplomatic Washington, inasmuch as the government he represented—President Huerta's—had no official existence so far as the United States is concerned. Those who were urging this move were also urging that the president recognize the belligerency of the constitutionalists, thereby giving them the active support of this government against Huerta. Secretary Bryan declined emphatically to comment on this report or to deny or affirm that this procedure had been examined into for him by his legal advisers.
