The great expense now necessary to make the kind of a newspaper that the times demands forces combinations. They are taking place all over the United States. There are but few new ventures in the daily newspaper field because most communities are fully served and the combinations indicated that they are more than served. Daily newspapers often lose fortunes for the companies operating them. It is a hard grind and renders no where near the compensation that the publisher or publishers are entitled to. The recent Chicago consolidations are but an instance.
