Can File Affidavit With Election Judges on Day of Primary if He Wants to Change.

According to a ruling made Wednesday by C. A. Robbins, assistant attorney general, voters who fail to file notice of change of party affiliation with the county auditor by tonight, will not forfeit their rights to do so on election day, June 1.

According to Mr. Robbins all that will be necessary on that date, should the voter have neglected to file his notice ten days before, will be to file an affidavit with the election judges. The only point against so doing, according to Mr. Robbins, is that it will cause more confusion and delay on the day of the primary.
