patriotism. The Burlington has asked  
its representatives at all points to  
fly a good sized American flag from  
some of the prominent buildings of  
the company in each place. Where  
no flags are in possession of agents  
and others the company will purchase  
one of good material. The flags are  
to fly every day except when weather  
is so bad as to damage them.

The new hull for the ferry Meek-  
er has arrived and the work of trans-  
ferring the machinery and construct-  
ing the superstructure began immedi-  
ately. The hull is 64 feet 3 inches  
long, 22 feet wide, 5 feet deep at the  
bow and 4 feet midship. It is con-  
structed of steel, strongly braced and  
first class in every respect, a credit  
to the builder, Webb Thomas, of Keo-  
kuk. It will require about two weeks  
to put the boat in shape for trade.  
Warsaw and Alexandria will then have  
as staunch a ferry as can be found  
along the river.


