MELON CUTTING TO BE OPPOSED

Utah Fears Railroad Will Increase Rates in Order to Make up Dividend.
 [United Press Leased Wire Service.]
 SALT LAKE, Utah, June 4.—The state of Utah will take steps to prevent the "cutting of a melon" by the directors of the Union Pacific railroad if Governor Spry heeds the strong protest made to him today by the traffic bureau of the local Commercial club.
 The road, a Utah corporation, has ordered an extra dividend which will split up among holders of common stock nearly \$75,000,000 in Baltimore and Ohio shares and distribute a cash dividend of \$3 a share. The traffic bureau maintains that such dividend is distributed, the state will cordially suffer because increased freight rates will be certain. The governor is asked to direct the attorney general to investigate.
 NOW CONGRESS MAY WORK ALL SUMMER
 Criticism of Roosevelt Likely to Prolong the Sessions of the 1914 Democratic Congress.
 WASHINGTON, D. C., June 4.—Senator Kenyon predicted that congress would be here nearly all summer, if not until September, owing to the consideration by the senate of a comprehensive trust programme.
 Senator Kenyon says Roosevelt's utterances criticizing the democrats for failure to deal effectively with trusts and monopolies have made the democratic leaders fearful of adjourning without enacting trust legislation, and though they want to adjourn they have practically concluded to go head.

Convicts as Firemen.

 JOLIET, Ill., June 4.—Two hundred "honor convicts" at the Illinois state prison here, members of the prison's volunteer fire department, worked shoulder to shoulder with members of the city fire department in fighting a blaze that early today destroyed the rattan shop inside the walls and for a time threatened to spread to other buildings.
 The convict firemen were released from their cells when the flames were first discovered. They wheeled hose carts to the rattan shop and had the blaze under control when city firemen arrived. None of the honor men attempted to escape.
