MOTORCYCLE COP ADDED TO FORCE

Special Officer Goes on Duty Today to Enforce City Traffic Rules and Regulations.

SPECIAL WAR ON SPEED

Open Mufflers, Missing Numbers and Dark Tail Lights Also Come Under the Ban.

Automobile drivers who start to hit the high places while driving inside the city limits want to keep their eyes open for a motorcycle cop in the future. To the police force has been added a special officer whose duty will be to enforce the laws regarding automobiles. The officer will be dressed in citizen's clothes and will ride a motorcycle which carries a speedometer as a part of its equipment.

Special war will be waged against violators of the ordinances regarding tail lights, open mufflers, numbers, and speeding, and this special officer will constitute the city's standing army in this fight.

In case an automobile driver is found violating these ordinances, the special officer will take the number of the car, and the name and address of the driver. Information will then be filed in the superior court by Chief Kenney, and the culprit will be arraigned before the judge to give his alibi or any other defense, give excuses, or plead guilty.

With the speedometer attached to the motorcycle, it will be an easy matter for the special officer to tell whether or not a driver is exceeding the speed limit. The court will accept the word of the special officer in this case.

Chief Kenney said today that car owners and drivers of the city had been given ample time to acquaint themselves with the traffic ordinances of the city. Small pamphlets containing these rules have been freely distributed and may be obtained free of charge at any time.

It was expected this morning that the special officer would go on duty some time today. He will work in all parts of the city, including the residence districts as well as the business streets. He is liable to bob up at any place any time, so be sure he is not around when you cut loose.

DAWSON IN RACE FOR U. S. SENATOR

Keokuk Man Will Make Fight for Toga of Stone This Year.

John M. Dawson of this city will make the race for United States senator from Missouri, according to Jefferson City dispatches. Mr. Dawson was in Kahoka today and could not be seen. If he is going to enter the race for Senator Stone's toga, it will mean that he will go back to Kahoka to reside, probably. The following is from Jefferson City:

John M. Dawson of Kahoka, Clark county, yesterday filed declaration of his candidacy for the democratic nomination for United States senator. His platform states that he stands squarely upon the national and state democratic policies.

"I favor special consideration for good roads and reclamation of the overflowed lands in Missouri," he says.

"I am against long tenure in office and I believe that public office is a public trust and that office belongs to no one man.

"I believe that the whole people should have a voice in saying who shall be intrusted with public affairs. At an early date I shall make more extended declaration along the lines of how I shall stand on issues generally if elected."

This makes three candidates for United States senator on the democratic ticket for the state primary—Senator William J. Stone and William H. Wallace being the others.

400-Pound Meteorite.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 5.—A 400-pound meteorite, composed of apatite, which recently fell on his ranch in Tuolumne county is being carefully guarded here today by J. W. Shores, a retire drancher. 
