### CLERKS FIND STORE FILLED WITH SMOKE

Fire in the Golden Rule Dry Goods Store When Employees Arrive This Morning.

When employees of the Golden Rule dry goods store reached the store this morning they found the building filled with smoke. On making an examination they discovered that a large box, containing a shipment of new blankets that had arrived yesterday, was smoldering and smoking badly. An alarm was sent in to the fire department and the fire in the box extinguished before it had spread. It is believed that the fire was a case of spontaneous combustion. The box arrived only yesterday and had not yet been opened.  
The Gamewell fire alarm system has been connected to the cereal works and was being tested out early today. Five boxes were placed in different parts of the big plant. They connect with all three fire stations, with the central office and with the water works. All the boxes are to be tested every evening at 6 o'clock. The Taber Lumber company has had this system installed at their plant for several years past. The cereal works is the second company in the city to adopt it.
