BATH HOUSES AT HAMILTON BEACH

Installation of These Conveniences by J. B. Chute Has Made Swimming Place There Still More Popular.

IS IN FINE SHAPE NOW

Dressing Rooms Are Provided and Place Will be Wired and Spectators Benches Placed.

Lakeview beach at Hamilton is private property owned and controlled by J. B. Chute, formerly of Keokuk who has built a residence on his property at Lakeview.

It was intended to develop the beach the opening of next year, but as parties became more and more acquainted with its existence, it was necessary to make some preparations this season.

It has become so popular that bath houses have been built with a view to accommodate the bathers for a nominal charge of 10c for the general dressing rooms or 25c for individual rooms and lockers.

The beach has been cleaned up so that it is one of the best sand bottom beaches in this part of the country, going out at a gradual slope without any step offs or holes clear to the deep water.

It is an ideal place for beginners as well as expert swimmers and within the next day or so after the electric lights and other conveniences have been installed, it will be an ideal spot for an afternoon or evening outing.

Some hundred or more Keokuk people have learned of the existence of such a beach and have taken advantage of it and are regular attendants nearly every evening. There has been as high as 150 people in the water at one time.

Being accessible to the street cars a matter of four or five blocks makes it very convenient for an afternoon or evening trip.

The owner expects to maintain this beach on such a basis that ladies can be present at all times and no disorderly conduct will be tolerated and proper bathing costumes are required before any one can avail themselves of the beach.

Plans are being made for next year which will develop this into a very desirable outing place.
