The War at a Glance

GREAT BRITAIN—Rushing of army of invasion to fight Germany across channel to France and Belgium continues although all details are carefully suppressed.

FRANCE—Invasion of Germany through Alsace and Lorraine frontier continues with fighting believed progressing but with all details withheld by censor.

BELGIUM—City of Liege taken by Germans but forts still hold out; allied French, Belgian and British army concentrating at Namur.

JAPAN—Two Japanese squadrons are in sea of Japan and government is prepared to strike in accordance with British-Japanese treaty if England's Chinese possessions are threatened.

RUSSIA—Army mobilization reported nearing completion; offensive assumed on Prussian and Austrian frontiers with all details suppressed by authorities.

AT THE PASSES. PARIS, Aug. 10.—Desperate fighting marked the wresting from German troops by the French invading army of the passes at Benhomme, Saint Marie, on the frontier below Mulhausen.

MANY STILL THERE. LONDON, Aug. 10.—With the arrival of the United States cruiser Tennessee here \$300,000 will be placed in the hands of the American relief committee for immediate use in aiding Americans now stranded in London.

IN SWITZERLAND. PARIS, Aug. 10.—Violating Switzerland's neutrality, the fourteenth Austrian army corps of 30,000 men under command of the grand duke of Tuscany arrived at Basel, Switzerland, today.

PARIS, Aug. 10.—French cavalry that the Germans are damming the Sella river, a tributary of the Moselle which forms part of the boundary of Lorraine in an attempt to check the French advance on Metz.
