

TEMPORARY ORDER AGAINST BENTLEY

Man Whose Wife Drank Poison Last Week Must Not Molest Spouse Who Has Instituted Divorce Proceedings.

CRUELTY IS ALLEGED

Mrs. Bentley Claims Husband Harassed Her After Original Notice for Suit Was Filed.

Another chapter was written in the domestic tragedy of Paralee and John Bentley when Mrs. Bentley filed suit for divorce against John Bentley in the district court.

The divorce suit which was filed in the district court charges Bentley with cruel and inhuman treatment, and alleges that he struck and beat his wife, cursed her and failed to support her.

She further claims that since the service of the original notice of the suit, defendant has harassed her and has threatened her unless she would withdraw the suit.

The Bentleys were married September 28, 1905, at Fort Madison.




One of the 1,200 horses entered in Iowa state fair horse show.
