ELDER APPOINTED TO MANAGE LEVEE

Council Names Former Mayor to Take Charge Over Improvement of River Front.

IS FATHER OF THE PLANS

Mr. Elder Credited by Council for Having Made Possible the Improvement of the Levee.

Former Mayor J. F. Elder was today appointed manager of the proposed river front improvements, by the city council in a resolution adopted by that body. It is understood that Mr. Elder will accept the appointment although he has not yet made known his decision. According to the action of the council, Mr. Elder is to serve without pay. With the approval of the council, he is to have general supervision over all the improvement work that is to be done along the river front.

As Mayor Moorhead said this morning, Mr. Elder is better fitted to have charge of this work than any other man. It was during his term of office that the plans for the improvement of the levee and river front were made. Mr. Elder took a deep interest in this work. He is given credit for reclaiming the river front, for securing the vacation of the levee and for planning the improvement proposed for it.

For Best Interests of City.
Mayor Moorhead's letter to Mr. Elder informing him of his appointment by the council follows:

September 14, 1914
Honorable J. F. Elder, Keokuk, Iowa, Dear Mr. Elder: The city council is unanimously of the opinion that the interests of the city would be best served if you would consent to take charge as manager of the proposed river front improvements. You are thoroughly conversant in general and in detail with what has been done and what is contemplated in the future along that line. You are also entitled to great credit for reclaiming the levee and for the broad and comprehensive plans it is proposed to carry out. By accepting this appointment, you will be in a position to crystallize your well matured and wholly admirable ideas into accomplished facts. It is the idea of the council to put you in charge of the improvements and to support you in every way possible. Any service that can be rendered by Mr. Schmidt, superintendent of public improvements, or by any member of the council, will be available to you on call.

Trusting that you will see your way clear to accept this appointment, in the interest of the city, whose welfare is paramount, I am,

Resolution by Council.
The resolution adopted by the council in which the appointment of Mr. Elder is made, follows:

Resolution No. 857.
September 14, 1914.

Be it resolved, By the city council of the city of Keokuk: That Joshua F. Elder, be, and he is hereby appointed manager of the river front improvements of the city of Keokuk without pay, and as such he shall have general supervision, subject to the approval of the city council, of the improvement of the river front of the city of Keokuk, including the levee, terminals, construction of retaining walls and all matters relating to the improvement of said river front.

In making this appointment the city council of the city of Keokuk expresses its appreciation of the invaluable services in this matter already rendered by Mr. Elder during his administration as mayor, and its confidence that this appointment will result in the largest advantage to the city of Keokuk and to its inhabitants.
