NATIONAL COLORS HAVE BEEN CHOSEN

Red, White and Blue, Choice of Executive Committee of Ft. Edwards Celebration for Decorating Town During Festivities.

IS OF NATIONAL SCOPE

This is Believed by It's Citizens to be Warsaw's Chance to Get Back Former Prestige.

The executive committee of the Fort Edwards centennial celebration announces that the national colors, red, white and blue, will be used in decorating, says the Warsaw Bulletin.

At no other time within the past sixty years has Warsaw been so conspicuously in the public eye as during the past twelve months, and especially the closing summer, the Bulletin continues. Back in the '60s there was no map of the state but what had Warsaw thereon, even though there were not a dozen other towns named. But through a combination of circumstances not necessary to relate, subsequently supplemented by other causes unprofitable to discuss, her glory waned; and though innumerable efforts were made from time to time by enterprising citizens to rehabilitate her prestige, seemingly the town continued to grow more inconspicuous.

FLYING SQUADRON TO DIVIDE STATE

Boosters of Greater Iowa Association Gather at Clinton Tomorrow to Perfect Membership Campaign.

TO COVER WHOLE STATE

Financial Support of All Iowans Will be Solicited in Prosecuting Crusade for Greater Iowa.

CLINTON, Iowa, Sept. 18.—The Flying Squadron, Iowa's live wire boosters, is going to meet at Cedar Rapids tomorrow and divide the state up into sections, each secretary assuming responsibility for three or four counties.

When the organizers of the association got matters under way they discovered that Iowa was so large it would be necessary to get the help of the active secretaries of the various commercial organizations throughout the state. It is following out this plan that the Flying Squadron came into existence.


THE WRATH OF THE GODS

QUEEN HEARS STORY OF BATTLE IN AIR

Wounded Private in Hospital Tells of Watching the Fight of Aviators.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.] LONDON, Sept. 4. (By mail to New York.)—Calling at the London hospital to visit the wounded, soldiers brought from the front, Queen Alexandra listened with the closest attention to the story of a thrilling battle in the air told her by a wounded private of the royal engineers. The fight was between a German aeroplane and French and English aircraft which sallied away to give battle to the invader, and ended their pursuit only when the German machine swooped down to earth.

The wounded private said he was resting on the ground after a hard fight, when a German aeroplane suddenly appeared directly over the British troops. Immediately from the rear, French and British aviators took the air. The troops lay still, watching silently the death struggle above them. First, the British and French airmen endeavored to outmaneuver the German and cut off his retreat. But the German began to climb higher in the air and the British aeroplane was seen to be mounting steadily trying to get above the foe and in a better position to shoot.
