

—The sixtieth annual report of the Burlington shows total operating revenue at \$92,750,834, as against \$94,374,485 last year. Of the total the freight business earned 67.71 per cent as against 67.88 in 1913, and the passenger traffic 27.44, which compares with 23.20 last year. There was expended for maintenance of way and structure \$12,002,827, which is 12.94 per cent of operating revenues, as against 13.28 last year. The percentage for maintenance of equipment was 17.13, comparing with 17.10 last year. Net operating revenue was \$30,602,536, comparing with \$31,531,494 in 1913. Total taxes during the last year increased \$465,541. The balance sheet of the company shows \$26,069,041 reserve for accrued depreciation. Net corporate income of the road is shown at \$17,114,407. After deducting 8 per cent for dividend disbursements paid during the year and \$5,715,875 for appropriations for additions and betterments, there was a surplus for the year amounting to \$2,531,404.
