PASTEURIZE MILK ORDER FROM BARNEY

State Dairy Commissioner Says Skim Milk, Buttermilk and Other Products Used for Feeding.

Creameries in Keokuk will receive an order today from W. B. Barney, state food and dairy commissioner, relative to the pasteurization of all skim milk, buttermilk and other products sent back to farms for feeding. The dairy commissioner will order that this be done.

Commissioner Barney will suggest also that milk in cities be pasteurized as a sanitary measure. The pans and cans in which milk is delivered must be thoroughly cleaned and sterilized, according to the order.

Denver, Illinois, Pedagogue Is Buried at Carthage Yesterday Afternoon, According to Request.

CARTHAGE, Ill., Nov. 12.—The funeral of J. H. Wilson, who died in Denver, Ill., of acute indigestion Sunday night, was held at the Presbyterian church in this city yesterday afternoon, Rev. W. F. Boyd officiating. Mr. Wilson was unmarried and he was very reticent about his private affairs. He has a sister, living in the east who instructed friends here to inter the body here. He came to Carthage about seventeen years ago from the east and was clerk under the late J. M. Sholl when he was bank examiner. He was deputy postmaster under Chas. W. Taylor and bookkeeper in the Dime Savings bank for several years. Of late he has been teaching school at Denver. He was a strong republican and received considerable benefits at the hands of the party.
