

GATE CITY TABLE NEAREST OFFICIAL

Comparison of Figures Show Unofficial Figures Printed Last Wednesday to be Nearer Correct of Any.

ONLY ONE CLOSE RACE

Hosier and Kennedy Are Separated by Less Than Hundred Votes in Returns Which Are Official.

The Gate City's election table which was printed in practically complete form on the day after election, was the most correct of any of the tables published in the other papers of city and county.

The only exception is that of the Hosier-Kennedy race. The Gate City's official majority was 2, while the official figures give Hosier 63.

From six to ten is the largest difference shown in comparing the figures. In some of the state officers all precincts were not secured by Wednesday afternoon.
