**LEASE GOLDEN RULE BUILDING**

Keokuk Electric Company Takes a Ten Year Lease on Building at Eighth and Main.

**WILL MOVE IN MARCH**

Building is Owned by Mrs. James Cameron—Give Luncheon to Visiting Officials.

The Keokuk Electric company has leased the building at the corner of Eighth and Main streets, now occupied by the Golden Rule, for a period of ten years. The lease was signed Friday evening, following the arrival of H. T. Edgar, manager of Stone & Webster companies in this district, who was consulted before the agreement was closed. The building is owned by Mrs. James Cameron, Sr.

The company which leased the building will not take possession of the building until the middle of March, Manager J. P. Ingle said yesterday. The company but recently moved into its present quarters and holds a six months lease on these buildings. The Golden Rule store has not yet secured a new location, but expects to do so within a short time. It probably will be moved farther down town.

The sales room of the Keokuk Electric company will be located in the front part of the first floor of the building. Part of the offices also will be on this floor and the rest of them on the second floor. The office of Manager Ingle will be on the lower floor. On the second floor will be a drafting room and a large club room for the employees of the company. Meetings of the High Tension club will be held in this club room.

Manager Ingle announced yesterday that the small car that has been used during the last week on the McKinley avenue extension has been taken off and in the future the park cars will run out this line every half hour. The cars that will go out the length of the extension are marked "McKinley Avenue" on the front end, while the cars that do not go the full length of the line are marked "South Nineteenth Street."

H. T. Edgar, district manager for Stone & Webster, Charles F. Wallace, vice president of the Mississippi River Power company, and C. W. Kellogg, manager of the company, were entertained at luncheon at the Hotel Iowa yesterday noon by the heads of departments of the Keokuk Electric company. There were fifteen present. Short talks by the visiting officials and by Mr. Kellogg were made.
