NO DAMAGES DUE IF SKIRT'S TIGHT

Palmer Trimble, Attorney for Burlington Route, Succeeds in Case for Damages Against Road on This Point.

JURY AGREES WITH HIM

Woman Sued Garment Only 32 Inches Wide and Case Promptly Went in Favor of Burlington Road.

A jury in a case in Kansas City recently declared that women wearing tight skirts were not eligible to collect damages for injuries sustained while wearing the tight garments. The case was against the Burlington road, and Palmer Trimble of this city was the attorney for the Burlington in the case.

Mr. Trimble secured an admission from the woman that she was wearing a skirt only 32 inches in width. The jury promptly decided that the woman was not entitled to recover any damages. The following dispatch from Kansas City appeared in the Chicago Tribune of Nov. 15, concerning the case which Mr. Trimble won:

When a woman wears a skirt so tight that it interferes with the free use of her legs, she cannot maintain an action for damages for personal injury. The skirt, the Wyandotte county district court holds, is contributory negligence.

Mrs. Della Wilson brought suit here for \$5,000 against the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad. She alleged that in alighting from a train at Hale, Mo., one of her feet caught and the ankle was broken.

The defense alleged that because of the height of the heels on her shoes and the tightness of her skirt she was equally at fault.

"How wide was your skirt" the attorney for the railroad asked.

"Thirty-two inches," she replied.

The jury deliberated a few minutes and then returned the verdict:

TWENTY-SIX LOST IN LAKE STORM

Twelve Bodies Have Been Recovered and Search for Others Continues.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.]

SAULT STE. MARIE, Mich., Nov. 21.—Although life savers in power boats continued to patrol the rocky shores of Lake Superior in search of possible survivors of the wreck of the steamer C. F. Curtis and the barges S. E. Marva and Annie M. Peterson. It was believed tonight that twenty-six persons and perhaps more, perished in the fierce storm that for four days has swept Lake Superior. The finding late today of four bodies, eight miles east of Grand Marais, on the south shore of Lake Superior, making a total of twelve recovered, made certain the loss of the Curtis. Only two of the bodies so far recovered had been identified. Two women, numbered among the victims, are still unidentified, although on the body of one of them was found a gold watch engraved with initials "R. B."

The three vessels, all owned by the Hines Lumber company of Chicago, are believed to have gone down when the gale reached its height on Thursday. Wreckage from two yawl boats found on shore, indicates the crew took to life boats in a last desperate fight for life. Each of the barges is known to have carried a crew of seven men, while the crew of the Curtis is believed to have consisted of ten men and two women.

BOB BURDETTE'S FUNERAL SATURDAY

More Than Ten Thousand People Attended the Final Services at Pasadena.

SKELETON OF STUDENT FOUND

Disappearance of College Graduate, Explained by Rifle Across Body.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.] PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 21.—With the discovery this afternoon of the body of Taylor J. Blethen, 26, nephew of Colonel Alden J. Blethen, owner of the Seattle Times, the mystery of his disappearance from the home of his aunt, Mrs. W. C. Fraser, of this city, October 8, is explained. Across his body, which was badly decomposed, was found a .32 calibre rifle, which leads to the belief that he ended his own life.

According to his brother-in-law, Fraser, who identified the body, the young man suffered from ill health brought on by over study.

The body was little more than a skeleton, due to exposure to the elements. Identification was made certain by the clothing and a letter found near the spot.

Young Blethen was graduated from Leland Stanford university a year ago and was considered a brilliant student. Hard study caused a nervous breakdown.

He was last seen on the streets here on the morning of October 8, by an attorney with whom he was acquainted. He carried the rifle found near his body and in answer to an inquiry, stated he was going hunting.
