

REVENUE STAMPS DUE DECEMBER 1

Louis Murphy, Collector, Sends Out Warnings and Instructions as to Use of This Necessary Paper.

CENT ON PHONE CALLS

All on Which Toll is 15 Cents, Are Taxed—Wines and Liquors and Deeds and Transfers, Also.

DUBUQUE, Nov. 22.—Schedules A and B of the war revenue emergency act, is to go into effect throughout the United States on December 1st, next. On and after that date it will be necessary to put internal revenue stamps (postage stamps will not do) on scores of documents and articles, under heavy penalties for failure so to do.

The stamp taxes affect a wide range of instruments and articles. Collector of Internal Revenue Louis Murphy has prepared the following schedule for the information and convenience of the people, showing the kind and denomination of stamps which must be used and on what they must be placed. There are three kinds of stamps—wines, documentary and proprietary.

Wine stamps must be put on all still wines, when sold or offered for sale or consumption to consumers, as follows: Up to one-fourth pint, 1/4 cent stamp; more than one-fourth pint to one-half pint, 1/2 cent stamp; more than one-half pint to one pint, 1-cent stamp; more than one pint to one quart, 2 cents; in other containers, at the rate of 8 cents a gallon.

Wine Stamp Taxes.

On all champagnes and other sparkling wines, and upon all artificially carbonated wines, stamps should be placed as follows: Up to one-half pint, 5 cents; more than one-half pint to one pint, 10 cents; more than one pint to one quart, 20 cents; and on all other containers at the rate of 20 cents per quart.

On all liquors (not whiskey), cordials, or similar compounds, stamps should be affixed as follows: Up to one-half pint to one pint, 3 cents; more than one pint to one quart, 6 cents; on larger containers at the rate of 24 cents a gallon.

"These wine taxes," the collector says, "have been effective since October 23rd, but there being no stamps, dealers were required to keep account of sales. Stamps may now be had and dealers should order at once, sending draft or money order with order. They will then cancel stamps enough to cover their sales and return these with form 672 filled out to the collector. They will stamp their stocks with the remainder of the stamps. They will not stamp kegs or large containers unless these are sold as such with their contents to consumers, but as they draw off bar bottles or other bottles, they will stamp these. All bottles are taxed as 'other similar compounds,' except Abbott's and Angustora, which are not taxed. Kimmel and rocky and rye are cordials. 'Straight' brandy is not taxable, but blackberry and such wine brands are."

Documentary Stamps.

The law makes it unlawful to record or register any instrument, paper, or other document required by law to be stamped unless a stamp or stamps of the proper amount shall have been affixed and cancelled as provided. The documents and instruments which must be stamped, together with the denomination, follow:

Municipal, state, county, town, bonds, etc., exempt.



loan associations or companies that make loans only to their shareholders, exempt.

Bonds, debentures, certificates of indebtedness (not bank certificates of deposit), 5 cents on each \$100 of face value or fraction thereof.

Sales, or agreements to sell, or memoranda of sales or deliveries or transfers of shares or certificates of stock, in whatever manner made, 2 cents on each \$100 of face value, or fraction thereof.

Sale, agreement of sale, or agreement to sell, any products or merchandise, at any exchange, or board of trade, or other similar place, 1 cent for \$100 and 1 cent for each additional \$100 or fractional part thereof in excess of \$100; if sale is accompanied by bill of lading, no tax.

Promissory notes, and for each \$10, 2 cents up to \$100, 2 cents on each additional \$100 or fractional part thereof.

On bills of lading manifest or other form of receipt where charge of shipment exceeds 5 cents, a 1-cent stamp.

One Cent for Phone Calls.

On telephone messages for which charge is 15 cents or more, 1 cent will be collected by the company.

On telegraph messages for which charge is 15 cents or more, a 1-cent stamp.

Indemnity bonds, except such as required in legal proceedings, a 50-cent stamp.

Certificate of profits or related instruments, on each \$100 of face value or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

Certificate of damage, 25 cents.

Certificate of any description required by law not otherwise specified in the act, 10 cents.

Brokers' note, or memorandum of sale of any goods or merchandise, stocks, real estate, etc., not otherwise provided for, 10 cents.

Deeds or other instruments conveying title to real estate, exclusive of the value of any incumbrance thereon, when the consideration or value exceeds \$100 and does not exceed \$500, a 50-cent stamp; and for additional \$500 or fractional part thereof in excess of \$500, a 50-cent stamp.

Instruments to secure debt are untaxed.

Entries for withdrawal of goods at any custom-house, not exceeding \$100 in value, a 25-cent stamp; exceeding \$100 and not exceeding \$500 in value, a 50-cent stamp; exceeding \$500 in value, \$1.00.

pot, phial or other enclosure that when cork is removed or box opened, stamp will be destroyed. The articles covered are "any essence, extract, toilet water, cosmetic, vaseline, petrolatum, hair oil, pomade, hair dressing, hair dye, hair restorative, tooth wash, dentifrice, tooth paste, aromatic cachous, or any similar substance or articles." Stamps should be placed as follows: Retail value up to five cents, 1-8 cent stamp; exceeding five cents value to ten cents, 2-8 cent stamp; exceeding ten to fifteen cents value, 3-8 cent stamp; exceeding five to twenty-five cents value, 1/2 cent stamp; each additional 25 cents or fractional part thereof, an 1/8 cent stamp.

How Stamps are Cancelled.

Wine and documentary stamps are to be cancelled by writing or stamping the initials of the person using them and date of cancellation across the face of the stamp.

Stamps may be ordered from the collector of internal revenue at Dubuque or the deputy collector in each of the following cities: Clinton, Davenport, Burlington, Keokuk, Ottumwa, Council Bluffs, Sioux City, Des Moines and Cedar Rapids. In every case order must be accompanied by draft or money order. Purchasers are urged to order only enough for immediate needs as the supply at first will not otherwise be sufficient to meet demands.



CONDITION PITIFUL IN BELGIAN CITIES

Starving Refugees are Pouring into Brussels at Rate of 25,000 a Day.

LONDON, Nov. 21.—Notwithstanding the amount of relief work which is being done by the Belgians, conditions there, in the larger cities as well as the rural districts, are becoming more serious.

Jean Van Branden, a member of the Belgian national relief committee, who arrived here today from Brussels to consult the American relief commission, said that the situation in Brussels was growing more alarming constantly as refugees are pouring into that city at the rate of 25,000 a day.

"This influx," he said, "is due to a lack of fuel as well as of food. Brussels has plenty of coal but the interruption of transportation makes it impossible to carry coal to remote villages. Refugees are flocking to Liege and other large towns as well as to Brussels.

"The people are entirely dependent on kerosene for both heating and cooking and the supply of this fuel also is becoming scarce. The committee is receiving petitions every day for supplies of oil."
