Date is Set and All Arrangements Are Being Made for City Wide Campaign of This Nature.

INVITE ALL CHURCHES

The official announcement of this date was made today, following a meeting Tuesday evening at which the preliminary plans were laid.

Rev. William H. Nell, chairman of the Ministerial association, said today that he thought the movement should be city-wide, and that the committee had accepted his plans.

The ministers and three laymen from each church met Tuesday at the Y. M. C. A., and perfected their plans for this service on Sunday, February 7.

Next Tuesday evening there will be a meeting of the executive committee to complete all arrangements.

State's Attorney Hoyne's assertion followed an investigation by the grand jury of alleged failure of Julius Rosenwald, president of Sears, Roebuck and Co., and multi-millionaire philanthropist to file a schedule of his personal property.

Whitman to Take Oath.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.] ALBANY, N. Y., Dec. 31.—Charles Seymour Whitman will tomorrow noon be inaugurated as republican governor of New York.

Following the oath-taking exercises, the inaugural ceremonies proper will be held in the assembly chamber of the capitol.

Governor-elect Whitman will proceed to the capitol for his inauguration under military escort. He will leave his official residence shortly before noon, bringing up a procession in which his military staff and several state militia companies will take part.

Beside Governor-elect Whitman the other recently elected state officers will formally take their posts tomorrow. These include: Edward Shoenek, lieutenant governor; Francis M. Hugo, secretary of state; Eugene M. Travis, comptroller; James L. Wells, treasurer; Egbert E. Woodbury, attorney general; Frank M. Williams, state engineer and surveyor.

Both the executive mansion and the executive offices here are today fully prepared for tomorrow's formal reception of Charles W. Whitman, governor-elect. Governor Glyn is quite ready to desert officially both places, making way for his successor.

The outgoing governor will resume his editorial activities on his local newspaper. He will first, it is probable, take several weeks' rest. As chief executive he took no real vacations.

CLEAN THE CITY OF ITS SHAME

Terre Haute Has Decided to Wipe Out Election Disgrace and Live Better Life in Future.

110 WERE ARRESTED

Members of All Parties Were Caught in the Net Spread by the U. S. District Attorney.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.] TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Dec. 31.—On the last day of a year marked by charges of election corruption, rioting and bloodshed at the polls and climaxing by interference on a grand scale by the United States district court, citizens of this city, variously known as the "hut" and the "little gotham of the west" today pledged themselves to cleanse Terre Haute of its blackened name.

Those connected with the city government who are under federal indictment include Mayor Don Roberts who has announced himself a candidate for governor, subject to the democratic primaries; Harry Montgomery, president of the board of works; George Ehrenhardt of the board of works; Elmer E. Talbot, city controller; Edward Holler, chief of police; John Nugent, former night chief; Thomas Smith, judge of city court, policeman and other city employes. Circuit Judge Eli H. Redman of Vigo county, and Sheriff Dennis Shea did not escape the federal dragnet.

Standing out as the principal figure in the big probe is Frank C. Dalley, recently appointed United States district attorney for the Indiana district. He personally conducted the investigation before the grand jury and decided a new interpretation of the federal law applying to the Terre Haute situation, the conspiracy clause, under which the dynamite cases were successfully prosecuted. Dalley already has been termed the Whitman of Indiana. He is a democrat.

Concerning this embryonic boom, Dalley said today: "I want no political gain. I'm just going to continue practicing law. I'm perfectly satisfied with the position I now hold."

Deputy marshals are working steadily rounding up the men named in the indictment. The complete list is not announced, but it is believed it will approach 130. Men include the three political parties. Of this Dalley said the bad state of affairs at Terre Haute indictment are not fewer than the strong work of the republicans has been as bad as that of democrats. Among the defendants in the Terre Haute indictment not fewer than twenty-five republicans. The city administration is democratic.

Dalley has in his possession so many voluntary confessions that he cannot tell the number off hand. These men asked immunity, but it is stated none was granted.

The inquiry into the recent Vigo county election began November 19. Since then four hundred witnesses, including politicians, "dope" fends, club women, and "dive" keepers of the tenderloin, have piled up a mass of evidence which Dalley declares he has pieced together to disclose a gigantic conspiracy to steal an election in the third largest county in Indiana.

Only recently, when Mayor Roberts gave the United Press an interview declaring he expected to be indicted, did the state at large have any intimation of what was to come. Vigo county politicians and Judge Eli Redman underestimated the nature of the federal probe. He began a counter probe with a county grand jury and subpoenaed witnesses who had been called before the federal body.

Charles Clozston, editor of the Terre Haute Post, charged in the Post that the "zang" had picked the fury. For this he was, in a few hours time, found guilty of contempt by Judge Redman and jailed. The court declined to grant him bail pending an appeal. Clozston's case came before Judge A. B. Anderson of the United States district court, who freed him on the ground that he had been jailed without due process of law. The Vigo county probe was dropped at once. Clozston's final hearing has been delayed.

Judge Anderson, who will try the Terre Haute cases, was the trial judge in the dynamite cases. The indictment is in four counts. It charges that the conspiracy prevented qualified voters from voting for candidates for the senate and house of representatives and from serving on election boards; caused men who had committed no offense to be placed in jail and held without due process of
