JAMES COWLEY HELD ON LARCENY CHARGE

Young Man Accused of Theft of Brass Valve from S. C. and S. Carter Company.

James Cowley, 21, 102 Exchange street, is charged with larceny in an information filed this morning in the superior court by W. H. Carter, president of the S. C. and S. Carter company. Cowley is charged in the information with the theft of one lot of brass valves and fittings, the junk value of which is estimated at \$7 by Mr. Carter. The stolen property is said to be worth much more, however.

Cowley was arraigned in the superior court this morning on the charge. He entered a plea of not guilty and is being held in the city jail in lieu of \$200 bond.

Another Earthquake Shock. [United Press Leased Wire Service.] ROME, Jan. 19.—An earthquake shock was felt this morning in the province of Cosenza, in southern Italy, according to an unconfirmed report received here. Cosenza has been frequently visited by earthquakes, and in 1782 the city of Cosenza, capital of the province, was destroyed by earth tremors. The province itself has an area of about 2,700 square miles and a population nearly 500,000.

Shock Drove Him Crazy. JEFFERSON JUNCTION, Pa., Jan. 19.—Crazed by word from Italy that his entire family had been wiped out by the earthquake disaster, Giuseppe Gabrindo, an Italian, ran amuck here early today with two guns and injured five persons, one of them fatally, and then committed suicide.
