VICTIMS OF AMBITION.

The list of aeroplane fatalities for 1914 is incomplete, declares the February Popular Mechanics magazine, because authoritative information regarding accident to military fliers engaged in the European war is not yet available.

Excluding fatalities directly due to the war, or occurring since the war began and not reported because of war conditions, the total aviation death list for 1914 contains 149 names. Added to the 192 of 1913, 146 in 1912, 77 in 1911, 32 in 1910, 4 in 1909, and 1 in 1908, this makes a total of 595 persons who have lost their lives through aeroplane accidents since the Wrights made the first mechanical flight.

MUST FIGHT THE GERMS.

People who have colds, according to the United States public health service, are suffering from an attack of germs which they carry in their own mouths or throats. These have been permitted to reside there in a state of armed neutrality between the germs and the body's defenses.

It is the duty of persons who have colds to take every precaution against transmitting them to others. The agency in the transmission of colds from one person to another is the sputum and this transference may occur directly by sneezing, coughing or expectorating. Someone has called the cold the strap-hangers disease because of the frequency with which it is contracted in overcrowded street cars.

PFANSCHMIDT CASES COST LOTS OF MONEY

It is Estimated That \$37,000 Has Been Spent in Efforts to Convict Him.

According to present figures, and they are well nigh correct, the three Pfanschmidt trials have cost Adams county \$25,000, and they have cost Pfanschmidt probably half that amount, making a total of at least \$37,000 that the suits have cost both the state and the defendant, so the Quincy Journal figures.


