

REFUSES TO HONOR THE REQUISITION

Governor Clarke will Not Permit Edmunds to be Carried Off to Colorado.

United Press Leased Wire Service.] DES MOINES, Iowa, Feb. 20.—The United Mine Workers of Iowa scored victory this afternoon when Governor Clarke refused to honor the requisition of Governor Carlson of Colorado, for the extradition of G. M. Edmunds, a national organizer for the miners union, accused by Colorado officials of the murder of Major P. P. Lester, of the state militia, during the battle of Walsenburg in the strike riots following the Ludlow massacre. The governor permitted the issuance of a warrant for the arrest and detention in jail of Edmunds, but declined to sanction his removal from the state without first being permitted to seek recourse through a habeas corpus proceeding in the district court. By agreement of attorneys, the writ will be instituted Wednesday afternoon. Prominent officials of the state organization, represented by a quartet of lawyers, protested to the governor at the extradition hearing against signing the requisition, declaring that not only was Edmunds absent from the scene of that in which Lester was killed, but that the Colorado officials are eager to lay their hands on Edmunds for other purposes than stated in the warrant. "It does not look good to me," said Governor Clarke, in rendering his decision. "The indictment merely charges murder and it appears to me that it should contain the elements necessary to lead to that conclusion. I shall order a warrant issued for Edmunds' arrest, but that he shall not be taken from the state until first his attorneys have had recourse to a habeas corpus proceeding. I am frank to say that if there was no court having jurisdiction, I would not permit him to be taken away on this indictment."

The quarantine may be lifted Monday. This was the announcement of Federal District Attorney Chas. Clyne made today following a long conference with Governor Hume. Examinations are being rapidly made to see if any additional herds have been infected, Clyne said. "It can be determined Monday, the quarantine will be lifted. Farmers will be able to resume shipments before March 1."

Cattle Infected. [United Press Leased Wire Service.] ELDORADO, Kan., Feb. 20.—Fifty hundred and nineteen calves on the A. Z. Schriber farm northeast of here, and eighty head of hogs will be killed within a few days as the result of discovery of the foot and mouth disease in the herd. Last Wednesday the farm was quarantined and a serum test today showed presence of the disease. J. L. Hunt, of Center, Colo., owns the cattle which were shipped here last November from New Mexico. Other cattle on neighboring farms are believed infected. State veterinarians have gone to inspect them. How the Hurst herd became infected is a mystery.
Not Making Parts. [United Press Leased Wire Service.] SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., Feb. 20.—Denial that submarine parts are being shipped from the Union Iron works to Canada, was made here this afternoon by John McGregor, president of the concern. In answer to the allegations of the German embassy in Washington, McGregor said: "We have built no submarines for foreign countries since the war broke out. We completed two a couple of months ago for the United States, but we are building no parts now."
