

OUTSIDE CONVICT LABOR OPPOSED Senator Fralley is One of Men Who will Oppose Jones Bill Which Would Change Conditions. DES MOINES, Ia., March 26.—Senators Sheehan of Anamosa and Fralley of Fort Madison have joined forces against the Jones bill, which permits the state to employ convicts on public work. The two senators do not object to the state establishing industries at the prison to provide employment for the men. But they are opposed to permitting prisoners to go outside of the prison walls and work in the city of Fort Madison or Anamosa, they say. "We do not want the convicts to compete with free labor," said Sheehan. "We will ask the senate to amend the bill so that prisoners shall be kept out of our cities." Senator Fralley was city attorney at Fort Madison when the mayor of that place had Warden Sanders arrested for sending convicts into Fort Madison to do odd jobs, as a violation of a city ordinance. Sanders appealed to the supreme court on a writ of habeas corpus. The case has not yet been decided. The attorney general held that the city of Fort Madison was without power to pass the ordinance on which Sanders' prosecution was based. If the legislature puts the Fralley-Sheehan amendment in the Jones bill, the question of convict and free labor in the two cities will be settled forever. At the present time Warden Sanders wishes to establish an automobile truck factory in the Fort Madison penitentiary. Fralley says he does not object to that. But he wants the entire industry to remain on state property and not extend into the city.
