—Dr. G. H. Sumner, secretary of the Iowa health board, has issued an appeal to boards of health, physicians, nurses and all others who have to do with health conditions, for co-operation in the sanitary surveys now being made under the direction of the federal authorities to improve health conditions in the state. His statement takes up in detail the things which the government is seeking to accomplish in this work and urges that everything possible be done by local authorities to assist with the investigation. The survey has been undertaken in Dallas county in the rural districts. This is regarded as a typical Iowa county and results will be worked out from the conditions discovered there.
—Efforts to save the life of Aquilla Daugherty of Warsaw by the amputation of both legs proved useless and the man who received his death wounds by falling beneath the trucks of a freight train near Columbus Junction, died at Burlington hospital. The victim arrived on Saturday evening at 6:40 from Columbus Junction badly injured and Dr. Tombaugh, Schaeffer and Patterson in consultation decided that the only hope of saving his life was in amputating both legs, the right above the knee and the left four inches above the ankle. The deceased was a man about 30 years of age and leaves a wife and two children in Warsaw, who make their home with the mother, Mrs. James Daugherty.
