BIRD FINISHES GAME SERVING FIFTH TERM

Two Runs Made Off Second Anson Pitcher in Eighth—Lizz Richards Handy With Stick

Driving Beard to cover in the fifth inning after making five hits and four runs, the Indians won easily over Marshalltown in the first game of the series here yesterday afternoon.

Beard was going great guns all the way up to the ill-fated fifth. But twelve men faced him in these first four innings and not a one was able to touch him for anything like a hit.

But the fifth was like the dawning of another day. Swick lead off with a hard-driven double to left. Giffin followed him with a triple to right.

Dean Bixby, chucking for Boyle's aggression, added another win to his steadily growing string of victories, by pitching a very neat game.

The last two runs scored by the Indians were made on plays not often seen. Le Beau had led off with a walk. Swick laid down a sacrifice.

RICHARDS RESIGNS AS ANSON MANAGER

Directors of Marshalltown Club Make Definite Announcement That "Lizz" Has Quit

All games in the Central association today were stopped for a period of ten minutes, from 4:25 to 4:35 in respect to the memory of W. H. Davidson, late vice president of the Central association, who died at Burlington Monday evening.

His funeral, held at Burlington this afternoon, was attended by a number of league officials.

Mr. Davidson was serving his fifth consecutive term as vice president of the league. He was first elected at a meeting held in Chicago, being nominated by Hugh Hill of Kewanee.

As vice president of the Central association his influence has been one of the strongest factors in making this organization the leading minor league of its classification in the country.

RICHARDS RESIGNS AS ANSON MANAGER

Directors of Marshalltown Club Make Definite Announcement That "Lizz" Has Quit

REMAINS IN CHARGE

Richards Will Continue in Charge of Club Until His Successor Has Been Chosen

MARSHALLTOWN, Ia., June 30.—The directors of the Marshalltown Baseball association have received the resignation of Manager Frank Richards, and it is likely that a new pilot for the Ansons will take charge of the team within a week.

Expect Answer Thursday. A definite answer from the man who is considered first choice is expected not later than Thursday.

Richards' Resignation Voluntary. Richards' resignation was voluntary, and in notifying the directors that he desired a release from the burden of directing the affairs of the club, he stated that he had done all that he could to give the town a good team.

Richards Remains in Charge. Manager Richards will remain in charge of the team until his successor is chosen. There will be no more changes in the team before the new manager takes up the reins.
