Be It Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Keokuk, that pursuant to a resolution of necessity proposed at a meeting of this council on the 22d of July, 1915, and duly passed by this council at a meeting held on the 22d day of July, 1915, it is hereby ordered, upon motion of this council, without petition of property owners, that the following named street and parts of street, to-wit: Nineteenth from south line of Johnson to the north line of Exchange street, be improved in the manner specified in the said resolution of necessity, as passed, by paving the same with concrete and curbing with cement, about 1270 square yards of paving and 620 feet of curbing, more or less, and

Be It Further Resolved, That the City Clerk be, and he is, hereby instructed to advertise for proposals for construction of the improvement above designated, as required by law; the improvement to be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor prepared by the City Engineer, and approved by this council on the 31st day of July, 1915; the work to be commenced on or before the first day of September, 1915, and fully completed on or before the first day of October, 1915, payment therefor to be made in special assessment certificates bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, issued in accordance with the provisions of law, to the extent that the cost of the same is assessable by law against the privately owned property abutting on and adjacent to said improvement, according to area, so as to include one-half of the privately owned property between the street improved and the next street, whether such privately owned property abut upon said street or not, but in no case shall privately owned property situated more than three hundred (300) feet from the street so improved be so assessed, (and against said railway or street railways whose tracks are located thereon), which said plat and schedule, when completed, shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.

Whereas, On the Fifth Day of April, 1915, Cameron, Joyce & Company did enter into contract with the City of Keokuk for the improvement of Exchange street from the east side of Seventeenth to the west side of Kilbourne Place, by paving and curbing the same, which contract was duly approved by this council on the 14th day of April, 1915, and

Whereas, On the 3rd day of June, 1915, Cameron, Joyce & Company did enter into contract with the City of Keokuk for the improvement of Kilbourne Place from the westerly side of Exchange to the easterly side of Bank by paving and curbing the same, which contract was duly approved by this Council on the third day of June, 1915, (all resolutions having been waived), and

Whereas, The said Cameron, Joyce & Company has fully completed the construction of the said improvement in accordance with the terms and conditions of the said contracts and the plans and specifications hereto attached, as shown by the certificate of the City Engineer, filed with the City Clerk on the 25th day of February, 1915 and the 3rd day of June, 1915, respectively, therefore,

Be It Resolved, By the City Council of the City of Keokuk, that the said report of the City Engineer be, and the same is hereby approved and adopted, and that the paving and curbing constructed on Exchange street from the east side of Seventeenth to the west side of Kilbourne Place, and also constructed on Kilbourne Place from the westerly side of Exchange to the easterly side of Bank, by Cameron, Joyce & Company, under its contracts with the City of Keokuk, bearing date of April 5 and June 3, 1915, are hereby approved and accepted, as having been fully completed under the terms and conditions of the said contracts and the plans and specifications thereto attached, and the cost thereof is hereby determined to be as follows: Exchange street from Seventeenth to Kilbourne Place \$7,489.64 Kilbourne Place from Exchange to Bank 403.42 as shown in said report of the City Engineer; and
