

CHARLES HORNUNG DIED IN TEXAS

Former Keokuk Resident Died in the Hospital at That Place on Friday Evening Following an Operation.

WAS BORN HERE IN 1881

Woke up Homestead Near Guymon Oklahoma, in 1906—Parents and Brothers and Sisters Reside Here.

According to word received here by relatives, Charles F. Hornung, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Hornung of this city, and a former Keokuk resident, passed away Friday night at eleven o'clock at Dalhart, Texas. His home was at Guymon, Okla., but last morning he was hurried to Dalhart for an operation for appendicitis, but it proved to be too late.

He was born in Keokuk on January 20, 1881, and spent his early life in this vicinity. In 1906 he went to Guymon and took up a homestead. He came back two years later and was married here to Miss Dora Visser, a Keokuk girl. The following spring he went back to Guymon and had resided there since.

His death comes as a great blow to the family for it was just four months ago that death took a member of the circle. Mr. Hornung was a member of the Trinity M. E. church and always tried to do his duty. He was a kind and loving father and a devoted husband.

He is survived by his wife and four children, the oldest of the later being only seven years. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Hornung, also survive, with the following brothers and sisters: William Hornung, John F. Hornung, Nellie Hornung, Ellen Hornung and Kathryn Hornung. It is not known if the remains are to be brought to Keokuk.
