**4,140 HIT THE SAWDUST TRAIL**

Evangelist Chas. Reign Scoville Closes Successful Campaign in Jefferson City, Mo., Last Night  
**OVER \$4,000 IS RAISED**  
 Converts Yesterday Were Two Hundred and Sixty-One—Next Stop at Emporia, Kansas.

According to a telegram received here today by C. E. Durgan from Guy S. Williams, publicity agent for Charles Reign Scoville, the evangelist who has been secured to conduct a series of meetings here next week, Scoville closed his six week campaign in Jefferson City, Mo., last night with a total of 4,140 converts. Over four thousand dollars were raised by the twenty thousand persons who attended his three meetings yesterday, as a thank offering to the evangelist.  
 The total number of converts yesterday was two hundred and sixty-one, one of the records of the six week's meetings. Among the trail hitters were dozens of Missouri's most prominent office holders and state politicians.  
 Evangelist Scoville will address a union service at the Lafayette Park Methodist church at St. Louis on Tuesday night and next week he will begin a revival campaign in Emporia, Kansas.
