ANNUAL MEETING ON JANUARY 18

Keokuk Industrial Association Will Hear Report of Year's Work and Nominate Directors.

ELECTION NEXT DAY

Four Directors Including President Kiedalsch Finish Their Terms With Association This Year.

What promises to be one of the most interesting annual meetings of the organization yet held, will be that of the Keokuk Industrial Association which is scheduled for January 18. At this meeting a report of the year's work will be made by the president, J. Albert Kiedalsch, and there will be a nomination of directors for the ensuing year. The meeting will then adjourn to January 19, when the directors will be voted for. The report of the year's work will be made in brief fashion. The result of the work of the association in the year which is passing is shown in the new smelters, the River Smelting and Refining Co., and the Keokuk Electro-Metals Co., the Standard Four Tire company, the Carter-Phelps company and perhaps some others which may be secured before the eighteenth of January.

Terms Will Expire. The term of J. Albert Kiedalsch will expire with the meeting on January 18. This fact is causing general regret among the Keokuk boosters, for Mr. Kiedalsch has given a splendid account of his administration, and has brought a number of industries into Keokuk and has paved the way for others. Three other directors will leave the board this year, also. They are H. Boyden Blood, James T. McCarthy and Jacob Schouten. Those who have a year to serve are A. Hollingsworth, Stephen Irwin, C. P. McFarland, C. A. McNamara and Ira W. Willis. The directors having two years more to serve are: B. B. Hobbs, A. W. Hulson, J. P. Ingle, T. H. Joyce and J. W. Winger. The present directorate is composed of fourteen men since L. F. Rollins resigned several months ago when he left the city. The board will be recruited to its full strength after the annual meeting in January.
