

EXPERIMENTS IN BURNING DYNAMITE

Louis Atkins and Earl Eastman Attempt to Add to Scientific Knowledge of the Age.

WERE ARRESTED IN TIME

Information Filed Against Them Accusing Them of Breaking and Entering Building to Get Explosive.

Dynamite hath no terrors for Louis Atkins, seventeen, and Earl Eastman, of about the same age.

Officers of the law caught the two as they were attempting to light a stick of the high explosive, apparently to see if it would burn. The hand of authority closed over the modern scientists before they added their little tale to the scientific annals of the age.

The arrests came as the result of information filed in the superior court against the two for breaking and entering the building of the Keokuk Quarry & Construction company, at Fifth and Cedar streets and taking away \$10 worth of dynamite.

Eastman is a stranger here, but Atkins has been in police scrapes in the past. On December 19, 1914, he was ordered committed to the state industrial school, but this was suspended on good behavior. This suspension will be revoked and Atkins will be sent to Eldora as the result of his latest escapade.

The Keokuk Quarry & Construction company has lost dynamite before through the activities of parties unknown. Evidence at one time pointed to the fact that a box of it had been knocked open with an axe, showing that the welder of this object had little regard for the reputed qualities of the explosive. The dynamite is used by the company for blasting purposes in its quarry at Fifth and Cedar streets.



THAW OUT ENGINE WITH HOT WATER

State Engineering College Offers Some Advice to Follow if Cooling System Freezes Up.

Much damage may result by not properly thawing out the auto cooling system in case it freezes up in the winter time, says the engineering extension department of Iowa State college.

Before the engine is turned, the water pump, if there is one on the car, should be thawed out with rags and hot water. Then the engine may be started, but the radiator should be blanketed until the circulating system has been warmed throughout and the radiator is warm clear to the bottom.

The radiator should be kept partially covered, and the bottom should be protected rather than the top, because the freezing begins there.
