MOVIE PROGRAM AT HIGH SCHOOL

Over Rockies of Canadian Pacific Will be One of the Features of Show Tomorrow Night.

SHOE MANUFACTURING

Program Will Include a Number of Interesting Features and Will Show Paris and Portugal.

At the high school tomorrow night another motion picture program will be given. The reels which will be shown Friday night at 7:30 o'clock will include the following:

Over the Rockies by the Canadian Pacific.—These pictures are taken over what is generally conceded to be the most beautiful mountain scenery in the western hemisphere, if not in the entire world. They show many scenic features of the railroads built through the Canadian Rockies and fine pictures of some of the C. P. R.'s excellent hotel system, beautiful hostleries, the equal of any which can be found in the large cities, scattered here and there through this wild mountain region. Pictures of Banff and the Bow River, herds of buffalo and wild mountain goat in the national parks; beautiful water falls, pictures of the great divide where the waters of the continent divide into two parts, one flowing to the Pacific and the other to the Atlantic. Pictures of Lake Louise, Mirror lake and Agnes lake, the lakes above the clouds; the great glacier at Glacier, British Columbia, and stately Mt. Sir Donald. There are beautiful pictures of Vancouver, the western terminus of the Canadian Pacific railway and of Victoria, the capital of British Columbia.


The Making of a Shoe.—This picture, put out by the United Shoe Machinery Manufacturing company, brings out in a striking way the difference between modern methods of shoe manufacture and the old hand method. It shows the complete process, starting in with the tanned hide and coming out with the shoe boxed ready for market. Some interesting steps in the process of manufacture are as follows: Cutting out the soles and uppers. While this is done by machinery, each piece is cut separately because there is no standard size and shape to the hides. The uppers are stitched and lined and eyelets are inserted. The shoe is then laced over a form and the tip fastened on. After this, the sole and heel are attached, sewed, blacked and polished. Most of the pictures are close-up views of the machinery at work and show the many operations, as well as a trip through the factory.

Parks of Paris (split reel).—Pictures in natural color of some of the recreation spots of Paris. Park Naumachie with its fountains and lagoons and corinthian colonnades. General views of parks Cour La Reine, Champs Elysees, Lake Bois de Boulogne, and the tiny tramway which serves as a sort of scenic railway. The Trocadero Gardens and Buttes Chaumont. Fictorial Portugal (split reel).—Views of the life and scenery of this picturesque little nation. A cattle fair in Vienna. Pictures of fishing for lampreys, a sort of sea fish which resembles the eel. Womens' work in Oporto. Onion and fish dealers who carry their wares on their heads. Water and wine carriers balance large jugs on their heads with perfect ease. Pictures of wood sellers who carry their wares to market in huge bundles on their back. The Cuttlefish.—A nature study picture of the life history of the cuttlefish, showing the eggs attached to sea weeds, their development and method of hatching. The cuttlefish and how he fights his enemies.
