Of the 250,000 business corporations in the United States, over 190,000 make less than \$5,000 a year, and more than 100,000 make nothing at all.

"The Business Death-Rate" contributed to System (Chicago, January) have been brought out recently by a national canvass undertaken by the Federal Trade commission.

Waterloo, Iowa, for the purpose, Waterloo is a prosperous and a growing city, and its business failures are due to weaknesses in the concerns themselves, not to the town.
