TO FILL VAGANCY IN CONSTABLE JOB

Board of Supervisors Has Field of Three Men so Far, as Candidates for A. E. Hollowell's Place.

FOR UNEXPIRED TERM

This is Elective Office so That Old Soldiers' Preference Clause May Not Apply in Selection.

Up to date, three have announced themselves as candidates for the office of constable in the court of Justice Burrows, which was made vacant by the death of A. E. Hollowell. The successor will be appointed by the board of supervisors, to fill the unexpired term.

The three candidates who are most active and who are most prominently mentioned are Chris Locke, William Miller and L. A. Berryhill. The board will make a decision in the matter in a few days, it is expected. Some action may be taken at the meeting this week.

There is an old soldier's preference law, but this is applicable only to appointive offices. The constable's office being an elective office does not come under this preference law. Two of the candidates are veterans of the civil war.

The board has a republican majority, but whether the appointee will be a republican is not known. The candidates are members of both parties, and it is not made known whether the party line will be drawn in the choosing.

His subject was "The Twentieth Century Woman."

The entire officery of the Y. W. C. A., including the office force, attended the meeting in a delegation.

Mr. Ullom interested the women immensely when he started via the breakfast table to show why the president has been able to keep a "steady hand" and a "working brain" during the past months. "The newspapers, while they have spent much time printing speeches and notes of the president," said Dr. Ullom, "recently devoted a column to describing his breakfast table. Woodrow Wilson is extremely solicitous of his health."

Atmosphere Due to Women.

"Good cooking, he said, is conducive to good health, and good health is productive of good conduct. Woman is the creator, man the legislator. Woman creates the proper atmosphere in life—the atmosphere that is all-important."

"We've got to have the canals and dams and great pieces of engineering," he said, "but we've got to have a certain amount of refining going on. Woman is the refiner; man, the builder."

He paid a tribute to Miss Jane Addams, declaring that she is "the realization of the modern woman. She heard the cry of the children and sensed the mother love," he said.
