German-American controversy through the fact that Joseph Gieson, of Boston, was a member of her crew. The other ships were the Englishman, Sussex and Manchester Engineer.

The American embassy at Paris today forwarded to Washington the sworn statement of Captain Mouffett of the channel liner Sussex that he saw a torpedo approaching while on the bridge of the Sussex and tried unsuccessfully to maneuver his ship out of danger.

The torpedo, Captain Mouffett said, was about 200 yards off. Had he not swung the liner about, it would have struck amidships, causing terrible loss of life. Few lives would have been lost, he said, if there had been no panic.

The bodies of many of the Sussex' victims will never be identified. In the fore part of the third class quarters, wrecked by the explosion, were found charred bodies of women and children, their faces mangled beyond recognition.
