In the matter of the report of the Board of Public Works, dated October 27th, 1877.

It is hereby ordered by the common council of the city of St. Paul, that the board of public works of said city be and they be authorized to exchange street from Cedar street to Wabasha street in said city.

That said board cause said work to be let by contract, as provided by law, without one-half of the estimated cost being paid into the city treasury, and after said work shall be placed under contract, said board shall proceed without delay to assess the amount as nearly as they can ascertain the same, which will be required to pay the damages, and necessary expenses of such improvement upon the real estate to be benefited by said improvement, as provided by law. It being the opinion of the council that real estate to be benefited by such improvement can be found benefited to the extent of the damages, costs and expenses necessary therefor.
