The Treasury Ready to Commence Paying Out \$3,000,000 of the Dollars of Our Dads—Currency Obligations to be Redeemed With the Issue—Chicago Custom House Investigation—An Outfit of Chinese Officials Coming—Miscellaneous.

The Silver Dollars. WASHINGTON, April 28.—The attention of the treasury officials having been called to the fact that the silver dollar has gained no circulation, except as pocket pieces, a leading treasury officer to-day made the following explanation:

It has not been possible for the treasury until now to commence to pay out silver in considerable quantities, for the simple reason that there were not enough silver dollars coined to begin to use them in a general way.

SILVER SHALL BE PAID OUT for currency obligations to the extent that the government is required to destroy notes under the 80 per cent. retirement provision of the national bank act.
