HAYES REWARDS ANOTHER PRESIDENTIAL TRIUMPH.

Packard Given the Liverpool Consulate, Displacing a One-Armed Soldier—Bonds Called In—The Alleged Defalcation of Judge Whittaker, of New Orleans—Miscellaneous.

WASHINGTON, May 6.—The President sent to the Senate to-day communications from the attorney general and secretary of the treasury in response to Senator Howe's resolution of April 16th, calling for information in regard to the liabilities of W. K. Whittaker, arising under his administration of office of United States assistant treasury collector of internal revenue at New Orleans, and as to the amounts taken by the Government to enforce them.

Secretary Sherman states that \$11,182 is pending against Whittaker on his account as collector of internal revenue from December, 1863, to April, 1865. While Whittaker was in the rear of No. 1,327 Second street was also burned. Loss \$15,000.
