The District Court finds J. W. Robinson guilty of Polygamy—Boon Cases Disposed Of—Business for To-day.

In the district court since our last report the business transacted was as follows: In the case of Louis Schultz against the Mississippi and Rum River Boom company the jury brought in a verdict for the plaintiff in the sum of \$200, and interest from May 31st, 1877, at 7 per cent., amounting to \$132.62, a copy of proceedings for 30 days was granted defendant.

ST. PAUL TRADE

Weekly Review of the Wholesale Markets.

Whether it can be attributed to the weather or any other extraneous cause it scarcely matters, but the fact still remains that the past week has shown more or less of a falling off in all our principal branches of trade.

Many farmers have been misled by the high prices paid at this point for wheat, and notwithstanding the repeated assertions in this column that the buoyancy of our flour market was due to a temporary glut, there were many buyers in still higher prices in the near future who stored their wheat with full faith of a rapid advance. This week the collapse came. The buyers who had been running each other to the wall and bulging up the market came to an understanding and agreed to decide daily upon the figure. This decision was arrived at on Friday, and a glance at the following quotations for each day will show the effect on the market:

Receipts for the latter part of the week have been very light. A very fine car load of clean, plump hard No. 1 from the Northern Pacific was sold at \$1.00.

The demand for corn has been very light and the receipts liberal.

There is no change reported for flour; the market is steady and prices firm at former quotations.

Dry goods houses have been quieter during the week, but there still continues a good demand for summer fabrics. Orders for dresses, suits, and coats are not so heavy, but more varied. There are no changes in quotable articles.

Hardware is one of the branches which has had no change in its trade since spring. The requirements of husbandry and heavy goods are very active. There are no changes in prices.

Hides and furs continue dull. There is no market either in Eastern cities or Europe.
