ST. PAUL TRADE.

Weekly Review of the Wholesale Markets.

Office of the Globe, St. Paul, Oct. 1.

The supply of new wheat during the week has been quite liberal and the prices considerably lower.

There appears to be considerable dissatisfaction expressed by farmers with the mode of grading wheat with the "tester." They may, and rightly, too, that the tester does not hold nations (about two quarts) to give a fair test of the weight of the grain.

It is especially the case with the new crop, which differs so materially even in the same load. One sack may weigh 57 pounds, another 55 and another 60 and so on, and in the same sack one tester would produce 50 pounds and another 57 or 58; and again an expert with the tester can manipulate so that it would vary a pound or two in favor of the purchaser.

There is one thing to be said, however, in favor of the buyers here that their scale of price between grading is according to the weight; for instance, in No. 2 they give the way from 65c up to 75c, according to weight. It has been stated in these columns before that the new crop of wheat for producing flour is better than any one anticipated. Besides, by actual experiment, the writer has many proofs of this supplied him. One farmer has some rejected wheat ground which yielded 10 pounds to the bushel of good flour, and the flour was found to be very strong in all its qualities and making very sweet and light bread. It would be better for farmers to keep for home consumption the lighter grades of wheat and sell the heavier to dispose of the former at "no price at all"—actual fact will prove to them if their wheat is in good condition that low grades will yield well a good, sweet, wholesome and nutritious flour.

The demand for corn has increased during the past week, and considerable shipments have been made daily to the Red River districts. The Northern Pacific Railroad has experienced a better demand than equal to the demand and prices remain unchanged.
