SUBSIDIARY COURSE.

WASHINGTON, May 26.—The bill reported by Senator Bayard for the exchange of subsidiary coins for lawful money and making such coins a legal tender in sums not exceeding \$30 was taken up and Senator Edmunds argued against it.

THE MILITARY AND NAVAL COMMISSIONS.

When Senator Edmunds concluded, consideration was begun of the bill introduced by Senator McDonald authorizing the employment of the militia and land and naval forces in certain cases, and to report the procurement of arms and accoutrements.

LEGISLATIVE BILL SKETCHED.

The President pro tem. announced his signature to the legislative appropriation bill, which goes to the President.

TRANSPORTATION OF ANIMALS.

The bill relative to the transportation of animals was taken up. The bill is to be reported by the committee on agriculture and animal industry.

SENATOR MCDONALD'S ADDRESS.

Senator McDonald spoke in support of the reserved rights of the states. He said that the executive bill in the hands of the president was a radical exaggeration.

EPIDEMIC DISEASES.

WASHINGTON, May 26.—The house committee on epidemic diseases this morning agreed to report with recommendations the bill passed by the senate Friday last, relating to the national board of health as a substitute for the house bill of like character.

REFOUNDING CERTIFICATES.

The secretary of the treasury having received letters inquiring why he does not advance the price of refunding certificates, he answers that the law is mandatory, and directs him to issue them in exchange for the bonds of the United States, and fixes the rate at which he is compelled to sell them.

CONWAY'S MISREPRESENTATION CORRECTED.

The report of an interview with the President regarding the negro exiles is now said to be correct. The President's friends have been erroneous in several particulars. For instance, the interview desired to know definitely whether the President approved the proposition to go with chartered boats and deliver to thousands of the banks of the river, and it was said last

evening that he replied he thought the step ought to be taken as one of justice and humanity.

The President's intention, it now appears, has not led him to suppose that there are thousands of colored people on the banks of the river waiting for transportation, and he did not advise the chartering and sending of steamboats to carry them away.

SEEKING THE PRESIDENT.

President Hayes this evening received some 300 delegates from the international convention of the Young Men's Christian Association, which adjourned last night in Baltimore. The reception took place in the east room. Mr. Ames, president of the Washington Young Men's Christian Association, introduced the delegates and presented a resolution.
