"Well," added the President, "I have merely asked him in case I offer him the place if he will accept it, but I have not offered it to anybody, nor will I until the vacancy actually exists." Since the adjournment of Congress the Pennsylvania Republicans, after several consultations, agreed upon the name of S. M. Quay, and offered him as Pennsylvania's candidate for the vacant cabinet position. Their disgust was well imagined when, after all their trouble, and the previous declaration made by the President that the place was still open, upon being told that Senator Ramsey had been tendered the office in writing, and that he had accepted it. The respect shown the union soldier by the Republican party is not so sincere as Mr. Secretary McCary is contentary of this declaration. For some time there has been a feeling in the office of the quartermaster-general of the United States Army, Colonel Long, in a fit of temporary insanity some years ago, committed suicide on account of delusions suffering from a bad daily to be from wounds received in battle. His widow last week was summarily turned out of office, and with three children, is thrown upon the old charity of the world. The contrast to this picture is vivid. In the office of the public printer, the patronage of which is distributed by the Republican, is a widow, daughter, son and son-in-law of Colonel Yager, of Mississippi, who some years ago, in the streets of Jackson, was assassinated by a Republican. The Republican party, who at the time commanded the army, were stationed at Jackson. And yet another instance of Republican ingratitude to the soldier: A few days ago Jasper W. Johnson was appointed by Secretary McCary a first class clerk in the war department, and to make room for him a union soldier was dismissed.
