

FAST EASTERN TRAINS.

Independent New Trains, Leaving Chicago at 3:30 p. m.—Negotiations Pending for Close Connections with the New Trains and for Faster Time from all Western and Northwestern Points.

The Baltimore & Ohio company having begun making fast time from the Mississippi to Philadelphia and Baltimore, the other trunk line managers have felt compelled to put on fast trains from Chicago, beginning yesterday. These trains, leaving Chicago daily at 3:30 p. m., are to run through to New York in about 29 1/2 hours. We think line managers evidently expected that the western and northwestern companies would change their time of arrival at Chicago to conform to their new departure. But this the western and northwestern managers refuse to do unless the new eastern trains are a permanent thing—they believing that else the trunk lines would soon settle their little quarrel and drop back to the old time. The trunk line managers, it is said, have now promised that the fast trains shall be permanent if the western and northwestern roads will join them by changing the time schedules to make connection with the trains. At any meeting of western and northwestern railway representatives it is held at Chicago to-morrow to decide whether the changes of schedules shall be made.

Until our roads change time passengers from St. Paul who wish to take fast trains from Chicago will leave here on the noon trains, which will bring them to Chicago at 7 a. m., giving them a wait of 8 1/2 hours in Chicago, but only about three and a half hour more in through time to the seaboard than if they should take the morning trains with which our noon trains connect at Chicago. Our night trains arrive at Chicago half an hour after the fast trains have left, but in time to take, as heretofore, the 5:15 p. m. or 8:10 p. m. trains, which arrive at New York at 6:50 a. m., or about ten hours later than the fast trains. The trunk lines are now running four trains daily, one from Chicago, and wish to suspend one of them, which, however, they cannot do until the roads west and northwest of Chicago change time so as to connect with the 3:30 fast trains. The western companies, it is said, will demand at the meeting Tuesday one condition—that the Chicago 3:30 fast train shall arrive at New York not later than 7 o'clock, the hour of arrival of the fast train from St. Louis. It is probable an arrangement will be made which will result in reducing the railway time, St. Paul to New York, to about 58 hours.
