COMMUNICATIONS.

From A. R. Kiefer and others—

In regard to the Seventh street bridge, that steps should be taken to have a proper roadway over Trout brook valley, that the same may be macadamized, etc.

Referred to Aldermen of First and Fifth Wards, City Attorney and Engineer.

From H. P. Upham and others—

For the grading of East Ninth street.

From Patrick Nash—

For permission to take surface rock on Cherry street, that he will pay for same, etc.

From H. S. Saroni—

Calling attention to the fact that the lamp that was on the corner of Summit avenue and Grotto street—

To the City Engineer—

GENTLEMEN: At the work of the contractor for sewers in the Fifth ward is likely to be hindered by gas mains which are laid in the Third ward of Seventh street, and in the center of Eighth street. The gas company will not permit such pipes to be moved by the sewer contractor and is not willing to incur the expense of altering them, unless expressly ordered by you with an agreement that the city shall pay the expense.

The gas pipes are also laid in the middle of the street in Eighth street, between Broadway and Temperance streets, in the line of a sewer now in contract, but which has not been commenced.

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
