Yesterday morning the district court took up the case of the State against Patrick Shinnery, charged with the larceny of \$400 from a railroad man named John Wren. The robbery took place on the 30th of last January, in a Hill street baggage, formerly conducted by Long Kate. The men entered the place together, and being drunk, Wren fell asleep. On waking up Shinnery was gone and so was Wren's money. Shinnery was afterwards arrested by Sergeant Walsh, and nearly all the money was found on him. The circumstantial evidence is strongly against him. The case is being strongly contested by Mr. Erwin for the defense. It is still on trial.
