NEW YORK GRAIN DEALERS. Efforts to Amend the Rules Relative to the Delivery of Grain and Option Contracts. New York, July 15.—A meeting was called for the purpose of receiving and considering reports of a special committee appointed to confer with the committee on grain, relative to the delivery of grain on option contracts. Two reports were submitted. A majority recommend a change in the rules of the grain trade governing transactions, that identical grades of grain should be delivered, and be good delivery upon the basis of losing their identity in grade and equalization. By the rules of value of railroad elevators receipts of graded grain, having free delivery with receipts of grade in book in warehouse, it was reported, and declared in some of the reports, that it is expedient to change delivery on option contracts to their present basis of delivery, but recommended a change in rules so as to enable grain in approved warehouses to be good delivery to the grain of the system, permanent contracts for the delivery of grain in store on the basis of option contracts to provide a system of registering for all warehouse certificates issued and also for the general delivery of grain receipts, and to provide for equalizing the value of railroad certificates if delivered on contract, but to permit canal grain to be delivered on contracts at the option of the seller. This amendment, after some debate was adopted by 272 in favor, to 255 against. The result is practically a victory for the majority report.

He is especially proud of one big fellow, the weight of which cannot be estimated, but whose head is like that of a shark.

NEW YORK GRAIN DEALERS. Efforts to Amend the Rules Relative to the Delivery of Grain and Option Contracts. New York, July 15.—A meeting was called for the purpose of receiving and considering reports of a special committee appointed to confer with the committee on grain, relative to the delivery of grain on option contracts. Two reports were submitted. A majority recommend a change in the rules of the grain trade governing transactions, that identical grades of grain should be delivered, and be good delivery upon the basis of losing their identity in grade and equalization. By the rules of value of railroad elevators receipts of graded grain, having free delivery with receipts of grade in book in warehouse, it was reported, and declared in some of the reports, that it is expedient to change delivery on option contracts to their present basis of delivery, but recommended a change in rules so as to enable grain in approved warehouses to be good delivery to the grain of the system, permanent contracts for the delivery of grain in store on the basis of option contracts to provide a system of registering for all warehouse certificates issued and also for the general delivery of grain receipts, and to provide for equalizing the value of railroad certificates if delivered on contract, but to permit canal grain to be delivered on contracts at the option of the seller. This amendment, after some debate was adopted by 272 in favor, to 255 against. The result is practically a victory for the majority report.
