Proceedings of Board of Commissioners.

COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE, RAMSEY COUNTY, MINN., ST. PAUL, NOV. 1, 1881. The Board of Commissioners of Ramsey County met at 10 a. m. Present—Messrs. Grace, Fink, O'Connor, McIntosh, Wagner, Commissioner Grace in the chair. Minutes of the last meeting read and adopted.
