THE PAVING QUESTION.

A Correspondent Who Believes in Cedar Blocks.

To the Editor of the Globe. I read with much interest the communication of Mr. A. Dempster, city engineer of Pittsburg, which you printed in the Globe of Thursday morning, as I do all articles relating to the subject of street paving.

This is short and to the point, but so far as my observation has gone, is by no means the experience of other cities. In looking over my scrap-book to-day, I came across an article which I clipped from a Cleveland paper some months ago.

The comparative cost of pine and other modern pavements then came up for consideration. I wrote to Toronto for information regarding the cost of that city's wooden pavement, and received a reply that their tamarack pavement, which was laid in 1849, was as good in 1874 as when first laid, excepting of course the cost of the repair.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS.

Ex-Chief Justice Barbour, of the New York supreme court, died suddenly yesterday morning of heart disease.

Small pox is increasing in Cincinnati. Six deaths and twenty-eight new cases were reported for the week ending yesterday.

The Orangenmen, of Montreal, will appeal from the decision of the superior court, in the case involving the question of their right to walk in procession.

The steamer H. Moore, plying between Columbus, Ga., and Apalachicola, struck on Benton's Rock yesterday and sunk. The passengers were saved.

The stables of the Metropolitan Railway company, at Boston Highlands, the largest in the city, were burning last night, with the prospect of total destruction.

The United States grand jury, at Covington, Ky., reported indictments yesterday against forty-five men in various parts of Kentucky, for manufacturing distilled spirits without complying with the requirements of law.

Charles Williams and an Italian convict quarreled in Sing Sing prison, yesterday, and the former stabbed the latter with a stone, another Italian convict, Antonio Warigo, under fire sentence for killing his wife, fatally stabbed Williams.

During the blockade in grain in Philadelphia, the Pennsylvania Railroad company imposed a demurrage charge of \$1 per day upon all grain cars not unloaded within a specified time. The company yesterday announced its intention to refund the money.
