A Deadly Assault. Yesterday a man was taken in custody by the police for committing a murderous assault upon a man named Johnson, an employe in the Washburn C. Flouring mill.

The circumstances of the affair are as follows: The man in custody stepped up to Johnson in a boarding house at 703 South Washington avenue and asked him if he considered himself as good a man as a year ago. Johnson replied in the affirmative, when the fellow struck him a terrible blow upon the head with an iron rod, fell upon him to the floor insensible. Mr. Buchanan's Love. Mr. George T. Curtis, the literary executor of the late President Buchanan, again comes forward with an explanation that there is no truth in the story of Mr. Buchanan's love for a titled lady in England. Mr. Curtis says: "I believe Mr. Buchanan never destroyed any letters or even short notes that he received while in England, and I am confident that I have all that he wrote. The number is very great but I have examined them all; so that, in my opinion, the statement that the White House came near having at one time a titled English mistress has not the slightest foundation. The truth is that in his early life Mr. Buchanan suffered a disappointment in love, and the circumstances of which were so pathetic, that with his peculiar temperament and his marriage became impossible to him thereafter and I do not believe that at any subsequent period of his life he ever entertained a serious thought of it, although he always enjoyed the high society of cultivated women, and numbered many of all ages among his intimate friends. I write this in order that the readers of the forthcoming life of Mr. Buchanan may not expect to find in it the smallest contamination of

this story about an 'English widow of very high rank,' although they will find the cause which prevented him from ever laying aside his long-cherished celibacy." I am sorry to destroy any little romance concerning a possibly titled mistress of the White House, but I have the less scruple in doing so because the idea that such a possibility is a matter of any interest savors a little of the snobbish.

The lady referred to was, presumably, the duchess of Somerset. She and Mr. Buchanan were very good friends, but there is no reason to believe that there was anything more tender than friendship between them. I do not believe a word of the statement that they corresponded to the day of his death, or that he wrote her or received a letter from her after his return home. I have all his letters, public and private, and there is not one to or from the duchess of Somerset, although there are some from other English ladies. Mr. Buchanan remained in England for some time after his niece, Miss Lane, returned home. Last year, Miss Lane frequently referred to his letters to Miss Lane as sending her kind messages, and so are a great many other ladies, from the queen and the princess royal down through all ranks of society, as well as good gentlemen. Miss Lane's beauty, grace and good sense captivated many hearts in England, and, after she had come home, the queen expressed her regrets, in a pretty direct way, that she had not been 'detained' in England. But as to the supposed 'peppan' (female) uncle for the titled widow, I believe it to be a myth.

TABOR'S NEW HOUSE. The Palace He Will Build for His Oshkosh Bride. [Denver (Col.) Tribune.]

Ex-Senator Tabor has given up the idea of building a \$1,000,000 hotel at the corner of Sixteenth and Arapahoe streets, and Mrs. Tabor told a friend the other day that the famed palaces of the California bonanzas and the mansions of the Stewarts and the Vanderbilts should not be so fine as the one that is likely to be built. It will be in the middle of a block of ground covering thirty-two lots of the regular size. The mansion will contain about thirty rooms, and it will be arranged as the dwellings of the ancient princes were, for the entertainment of guests and to accommodate the furthest extreme of festivity. There will be banquetting halls, long and wide, each with different furniture and fittings, which shall be so selected as to serve for each and every occasion. There will be one room which can be used for receptions attended by more guests than can be accommodated in the reception rooms for every-day use. In the center there will be a fountain whose drops of spray, as they sparkle in the rays of light from a hundred gas jets, will fall upon the rarest exotics. The door will be a grand mosaic of Colorado's most beautiful minerals, cut and polished by skillful lapidaries, and arranged in odd and beautiful combinations by some of New York's most noted artists. The walls will be covered with beautiful tints, the soft-swelling dome will seem to fade away in the distance of the sky which will be there represented. Here and there in niches gracefully cut will stand the form of a Venus, a Psyche or a Diana, chiseled in virgin marble, and these will be relieved by rare paintings, executed upon the walls themselves, not hung there. Each gas jet will have prisms of glass so arranged as to send forth a rainbow of color, to be made to suffuse the whole room, and to give the flowing mountain waters and the colors of a rainbow. The sleeping apartments will be en suite, and the furnishings as truly elegant as the suggestions of an accomplished designer can make them. There will be every facility for amusement—a billiard room, with its constant attendants, a bowling alley; and a wide room for lawn tennis, when the weather will not permit the game to be played in the grounds outside. The stables will be on the same scale of elegance that the house is, and there will be saddle horses and driving horses to suit the taste of the most fastidious horseman. The grounds surrounding the mansion will become a garden of beauty. In the tower of the house there will be an observatory fitted up, where one may look miles away upon the plains or upon the most distant mountain peak; or, if he desires, make observations in astronomy. Architects will be once again to prepare plans for Mr. Tabor's approval, and before summer has set in work upon this magnificent mansion will be commenced.
